# Gentleman's Fancy Hat

The offset rib pattern is based on a sock from Weldon's Volume 16, published in 1901.



## Materials required:

Approximately 110 m bulky yarn (5). Sample was worked in Bernat Alpaca Natural Blends, 100g/110 m, 1 skein. 6.0 mm circular needle (40 cm) and set of 6.0 mm double-pointed needles tapestry needle stitch marker

## Size:

Men's large. This is a very stretchy hat which will fit a 24 in head quite comfortably with room to spare. At this length, the brim can be folded for a double thickness over the ears. Because of the ribbing, it will also fit a size down (22 in).

### Abbreviations:

SSK:slip one stitch knitwise, slip the next stitch knitwise, replace both stitches on the left<br/>needle then knit together through the back loops (decrease)K2tog:knit two stitches together (decrease)

### **Directions:**

Cast on 80 stitches and join for working in the round. Place a stitch marker to indicate the beginning of the round.

Work in K2 P2 ribbing until your work measures 2 in from cast-on edge.

### Pattern:

Rounds 1 & 2:	Knit (stockinette stitch)
Rounds 3 – 8:	P2 K2 ribbing (6 rows)
Rounds 9 & 10:	Knit (stockinette stitch)
Rounds 11 – 16:	K2 P2 ribbing (6 rows)

Work in pattern stitch until your work measures 7.5 in from cast-on edge. Finish on a round 2 or a round 10. If you finish on a round 2, move the marker back one stitch. If you finish on a round 10, move the marker forward one stitch on the last stockinette round. The marker should fall between the two purl stitches of the previous group of ribbing.

#### Decrease rounds:

* SSK P1 K2 P1 K2tog; repeat from * to end of round
K1 P1 * K2 P1; repeat from * to end of round, ending on K1
* SSK K2 K2tog; repeat from * to end of round
Knit
*SSK K2tog; repeat from * to end of round
Knit
K2tog around (10 sts remain)
Knit
K2tog around (5 sts remain)

During the decrease rounds, switch to double-pointed needles when your stitches no longer fit comfortably on the circular needle. After round 13, break yarn, leaving an 8 in tail. Thread tail through remaining stitches and pull tight. Secure tail and sew in ends.

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
